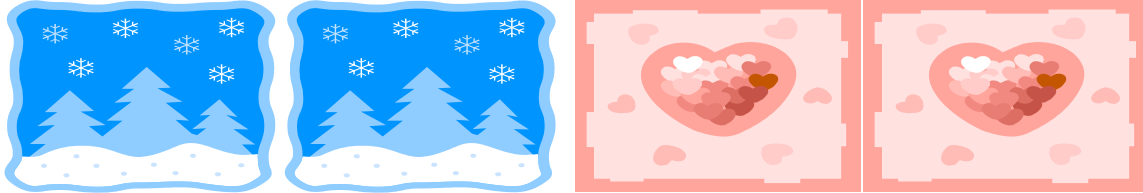

I do want to share with you a little tennis tidbit pertaining to the rules of the game. In doubles, I am sure that many of you have forgotten who should be serving or inadvertently returned from the incorrect side. Here is how to resolve both of these situations. I will be using phrases from Bass River's own Ed Leduc. If you or your opponent has discovered that someone has served out of turn, remember “SS, servers switch”. This means that when the mistake has been discovered, the points played count, and the correct server should start to serve from that point in the game. If you or your opponents have discovered that the return team is returning from the incorrect sides, remember “RR, returners remain”. This means that the return team will play out that game returning from the incorrect sides and then when the next return game comes, go to their correct sides. So “SS” and “RR”.

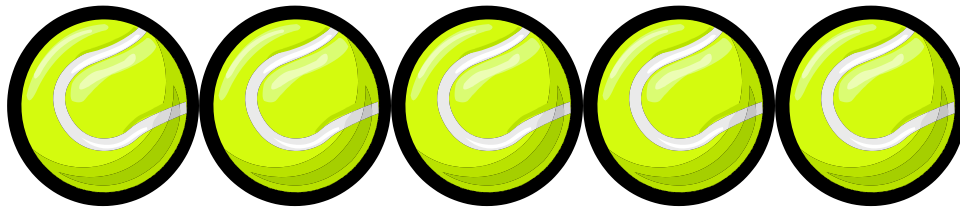
Enjoy the game of tennis and always play by the rules...

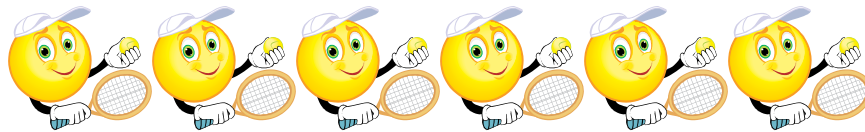


### Bee's In-House League
